### **SPSBS Breed Show 2026 General Rules and Conditions of Entry**

1. All ponies entered must be registered or eligible for registration in the SPSBS Stud book.
2. All ponies must be named on the Entry Form. No entries will be taken on the day.
3. Judging to commence at 8.00 am and will not be delayed under any circumstances. Once judging of a class has commenced, no late arrivals will be admitted to the ring. It is the responsibility of the Competitor to be in the ring on time.
4. The Show Committee reserves the right to amend, amalgamate or cancel any class and to replace a Judge if necessary.
5. The decision of the Judge(s) and the Show Committee is final
6. Any objection must be made IN WRITING to the Secretary within ONE HOUR of the alleged incident, together with a deposit of £50, which will be refunded if the objection is upheld.
7. Foals must be over 5 weeks of age.
8. Three-year-old fillies with foal at foot may not be shown.
9. Brown ponies are classed as black
10. Ridden and Driven ponies must be 4 years old or over, and no lactating mares in ridden or driven classes
11. Colts and Stallions 2 years and over must be shown bitted and it is advised they wear a stallion bridle disc
12. Stallions and colts (except foals) may not be shown in hand by children under 14 years; or ridden by children under 12 years There must be no colts or stallions in Young Handler classes
13. Correctly secured current British Standard skull cap or riding hat must be worn by riders whilst mounted on the showground, cones drivers, and handlers aged 14 years and under
14. A Novice pony is one not to have been placed 1st in any class prior to the closing date of entries
15. A pony is eligible to compete in one ring only with the exception of Ridden, Driven, Young Handler, Progeny, Veteran Classes, Novice, Broken Coloured and Bred in Shetland/Wales
16. If any pony is found to be suffering from an infectious or contagious disease, it must be removed from the Showground immediately upon the request of the Show committee or the Vet.
17. The organisers shall not be liable for injury or loss from any cause or circumstance whatsoever to any person, animal, or property. It is a condition of entry that each exhibitor and competitor shall indemnify the show against any such matters.

18. Only one handler per pony is permitted in the In-Hand classes
19. Exhibitors must be appropriately dressed, and no individual stud, person or pony names displayed in the ring.
20. All riders in the Open Ridden class must be of a suitable height and weight for the pony they are riding.
21. Ponies in the Ridden classes must be shown in a suitable bitted bridle.
22. Whips may be no more than 30 inches long and spurs are not permitted.
23. Should a rider fall off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring with the rider dismounted and take no further part in that class.
24. Exhibitors should be aware; a Judge may not:
  - a. Place a pony which to his/her knowledge has been bred, sold, leased, or produced by the judge or his/her immediate family, partner, business partner or employer.
  - b. Place a pony in which he/she has had a financial interest since 1<sup>st</sup> January of the preceding year.
  - c. Place a stallion by whom he/she has had a mare stinted in this season. preferably on the appropriate panel of judges, should be appointed by the Show Secretary to place the pony in question in its position in the class
  - d. Judge any rider/handler who has shown a horse/pony owned, produced, or trained by him/her since 1<sup>st</sup> January of the preceding year. Should a situation arise when such a pony appears a referee,
25. No ponies to be left on a parked vehicle overnight.
26. Mobile phones must be switched off whilst in the ring
27. Where classes are affiliated to societies other than the SPSBS the other society rules take precedence.
28. Classes 1-7, 9-19, 21-31, 33-36, 46-50 and 51-54 are judged under the rules of the NPS.
  1. Ponies must be registered in the main body of the Shetland Pony Stud- Book Society.
  2. Part-breds are not eligible for Mountain & Moorland Classes.
  3. Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members and at breed shows ponies can qualify for finals even if their owners are not members. Owners of qualified ponies must become adult Qualifying or Life members to enter the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show in August 2027.
  4. The highest placed pony in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified.
  5. NPS/WTJ Insurance Brokers Ltd. Home-Produced Ridden Championship - Riders of Home-Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show.
29. Annual Equine Influenza vaccinations are recommended but not required

Riders and Owners must be members of their respective Breed Society, NPS, UK Ponies & Horses, The Showing Register or BSPTS. Ponies must not exceed the height limits as stipulated by the relevant Breed Societies. Riders of stallions must have obtained their 12th Birthday (small breeds) or 14th birthday (large breeds) before 1st January in the current year.*

*Exhibitors are required by DEFRA to carry with them Official Identity Documents for all horses/ponies when competing or travelling. Competitors are reminded that it is a DEFRA requirement that the Official Identity Documents must be in the name of the legal owner within 30 days of ownership. This must be registered with the breed society, relevant studbook or ID issuing agency, dependant on breed/type of animal. Spot checks may be carried out at qualifying shows and by breed societies.*

*Riders must not compete in both the Mountain & Moorland Lead Rein/First Ridden Pony of the Year and the Mountain & Moorland Pony of the Year.*

*These classes will be run in accordance with the general rules as set out in the Horse of the Year Show rulebook, a copy of which can be downloaded from [www.hoys.co.uk](http://www.hoys.co.uk).*
